Did you know? Our association saved \$145,000 this fiscal year from solar energy. For buildings that have solar systems, over 80% of their energy comes from solar. Of all our facilities, over 50% came from solar. In November 2021, the Board opted to purchase the system we have. Two of the biggest energy users, the Aquatic & Fitness Center (AFC) and pump station do not have solar yet. However, the Long Range Planning Committee recommends the installation of an AFC solar array as a top priority in the 10-year Development Plan.
