The Activity Center is now a secure building. Just like our other secure facilities, you will need to use either your Member Card or FOB to gain access. You may enter through the front main entry, the front ramada entry (Bistro), and the Kiva patio entry. The scanner is located by the ADA push button. For ADA access, scan your card or FOB first and then press the ADA button. Let the Activity Center Monitor know if you have any concerns.

Neighborhood Pride: Many residents are taking advantage of the lovely weather by going for walks and bike rides. However, it's important to remember that any landscaping, trees, plants, shrubs, foliage, or vehicles/trailers should not obstruct the pedestrian right-of-way (sidewalk) as it can be dangerous for walkers. To ensure safety, please make sure to trim all tree branches and limbs up to a minimum clearance of seven (7) feet above the sidewalk. For more information, please refer to Master Declaration 4.17 & Development Standard 2.18.C.5.

Did you know? SCOV is the only active adult community in Southern Arizona with

a free Loan Room. You can reserve items online two months in advance. Log on to your SCOV account, find what you need and request it.
