No Fishing: At the Board meeting on May 28, the issue of fishing in the ponds was discussed. It was decided that fishing and swimming in the ponds would be prohibited, and "No Trespassing" signs would be strategically placed.

Bistro News: Some have asked why the Bistro will be closed on weekends this summer. In our first year, weekend usage reports showed we needed four times more patronage to cover labor costs. Thus, the Bistro will close on weekends, but we may reconsider if usage increases.

Did you know? Mary Cunningham and her staff of 10 maintain over 17 acres of decorative rock and plants. They're responsible for keeping plants from encroaching a 5-foot space behind 10 miles of homes abutting common areas, trimming 46 palm trees around our facilities, and checking retention basins monthly. Before the first frost, they cover the tops of around 150 cacti to protect them, among other duties.

Thanks to Ken Sandrock, Brenda from Golder Ranch Fire, Cintas, and Climatec, for working together to get the oven at the Activity Center kitchen permitted. It is now hooked up and working.

The May neighborhood tour organized by the Neighborhood Pride Committee has come to an end.
