All door-to-door solicitors must have an approved application from the Town of Oro Valley. The application is reviewed for good character, business reputation, they are fingerprinted, and the police check for criminal activity. If approved, the Town issues an identification card with the picture of the solicitor on it. One copy of the card is given to the solicitor, and one is retained by the Oro Valley police department. The approved hours of solicitation are 9 am-7 pm. When a solicitor comes to your home you can ask them to show their Town-issued identification card. They must have it. If they do not have the card, you can call 911 to report illegal solicitation. If you feel unsafe, call 911 to report the solicitor.
