As a part of this year's election, you will see a Ballot Initiative regulating our streets. The streets are owned and maintained by the town of Oro Valley and the town controls speed limits. As an Association, we have held the opportunity to set

guidelines for how the streets are otherwise used. An example would be setting a time limit for how long an RV can be parked. Arizona law 33-1818 has required the community vote to either retain this ability or default to the town ordinances. The Board believes that even if we want to follow the town code, we should not give up our ability to control what happens in our community. The Board recommends a yes vote. There will be two Ballot Initiative Forums on Tuesday, March 4, 9 am and 6 pm.

The Board has rechartered the Lion Head Fountain Task Force to pursue a text amendment with the Town of Oro Valley. Volunteers will be gathering signatures to submit with our text amendment application. The community's NPC tour is set to kick off on March 5th. Teams will be on the lookout for weeds, debris, plant heights exceeding 42 inches, tree and shrub overhangs, and the proper storage of trash containers. All trash containers must be concealed and stored on your property, out of sight from neighbors and the street.

They should ideally be kept in the garage or shielded by a structure or dense plant material. For further details, refer to the SCOV Development Standards, Section 2.5, and the 1st Amended Master Declaration, Section 4.9, available on the SCOV website or in printed form at the Welcome Center. Additionally, ensure your yards are clear of weeds and debris. Teams will report any violations they notice during the tour. Thank you for your efforts in maintaining the beauty of SCOV.
