There is a Ballot Initiative covering regulating streets. The streets are owned, maintained, and have speed limits set by the city. SCOV has the right to set other types of regulations setting RV parking on the street limit to 72hrs. Arizona law requires we vote to affirm that right and the Board recommends we vote YES. Voting YES keeps the option open to us. If the Ballot fails, street regulations defer to the city with no future recourse. A couple of differences between SCOV and the city include our prohibiting overnight parking while the city allows 48hrs. The city has no restrictions on RV parking however does not allow RV's to be washed on the street. A YES vote allows SCOV to retain the option of setting regulations. It has nothing to do with enforcement, just having the choice to set rules that fit for the community. Please vote YES. View ballot [here](#).
