Did you know Vistoso Helpful Hands is available in SCOV? Here are some stats from this past year:

We now have 81 volunteers, which includes 26 winter only, 3 summer only, and 1 on temporary leave. There are 21 cell carriers, with 2 due to be trained. Last year, 38 of the current total of 42 volunteers filled transportation requests, 6 volunteers are on the Ready Response Team (RRT), 3 provided short advance notice rides, and 21 volunteers are now in the handyman category. These help categories were the most requested, with 41 requests for transportation (3 for RRT). There were 69 requests for handyman work. Calls for the other categories of help totaled 34. Total call volume: 144 for the year, about 12 calls a month.

Our all-volunteer organization provides short-term help to residents in temporary/needy situations. We assist with caregiver relief/shut-in visiting, transportation, animal care, handyman, housekeeping/yard care, paperwork organization, errands, computer/bill pay, and meal pick up from The Views Restaurant. We also have a resource file with referrals for paid and other volunteer services available to SCOV residents. For short-term help, call (520) 447-0077.
