Asphalt Project Update: The asphalt project started on Tuesday, October 14 due to rain delay on Monday and concludes Friday, November 7. Tree removal has been completed. Initial preparatory work is October 14–24 where crews will address smaller areas of asphalt and concrete curbing. This phase is expected to cause minimal disruption. The restaurant and pro shop will remain open throughout the project. Please continue to visit and, when possible, use golf carts (except on October 29-30).
