Enhanced Parking for Everyone!

- Notice the difference in some of the parking stripes!
- A single solid line marks standard automobile parking.
- A **half-line** indicates an enhanced space, allowing **two golf carts** to park in the same area as one automobile.
- That means this space can fit **two golf carts instead of one car**. If you see a cart parked in one half of a split space, please park in the **other half** instead of taking a full automobile space. When parking **tandem-style** (one cart in front of another), please **communicate with the other cart owner** to ensure neither of you becomes blocked in.

Let's all help make room for everyone by parking neatly within the lines and working together to keep the spaces accessible!
