**In Arizona, golf carts** that are properly registered with the Arizona Department of Transportation (ADOT) and display a valid handicap placard or license plate are considered motor vehicles for parking purposes. This means they are legally permitted to park in designated handicapped spaces, just like any other registered vehicle. As long as the golf cart bears the appropriate handicap designation issued by the state, its operator is within their rights to use these spots—particularly when no golf cart-specific parking is available. It's important for all community members to be aware of and respect these guidelines to ensure accessibility and fairness for residents with disabilities.

**We'd like to remind all golfers and course walkers** to please respect the private property that borders our beautiful golf course. While it may be frustrating to lose a ball, entering someone's yard to retrieve it—no matter how tempting—is not appropriate. These yards are privately owned, and residents deserve to enjoy their space without unexpected visitors, even if the intent is just to recover a golf ball. Part of being a good neighbor is recognizing that once a ball lands in someone's yard, it's best to let it go. Please stay on the course or designated paths and resist the urge to cut through or search in private areas. Respecting these boundaries helps preserve the friendly, considerate atmosphere we all value here at SCOV.

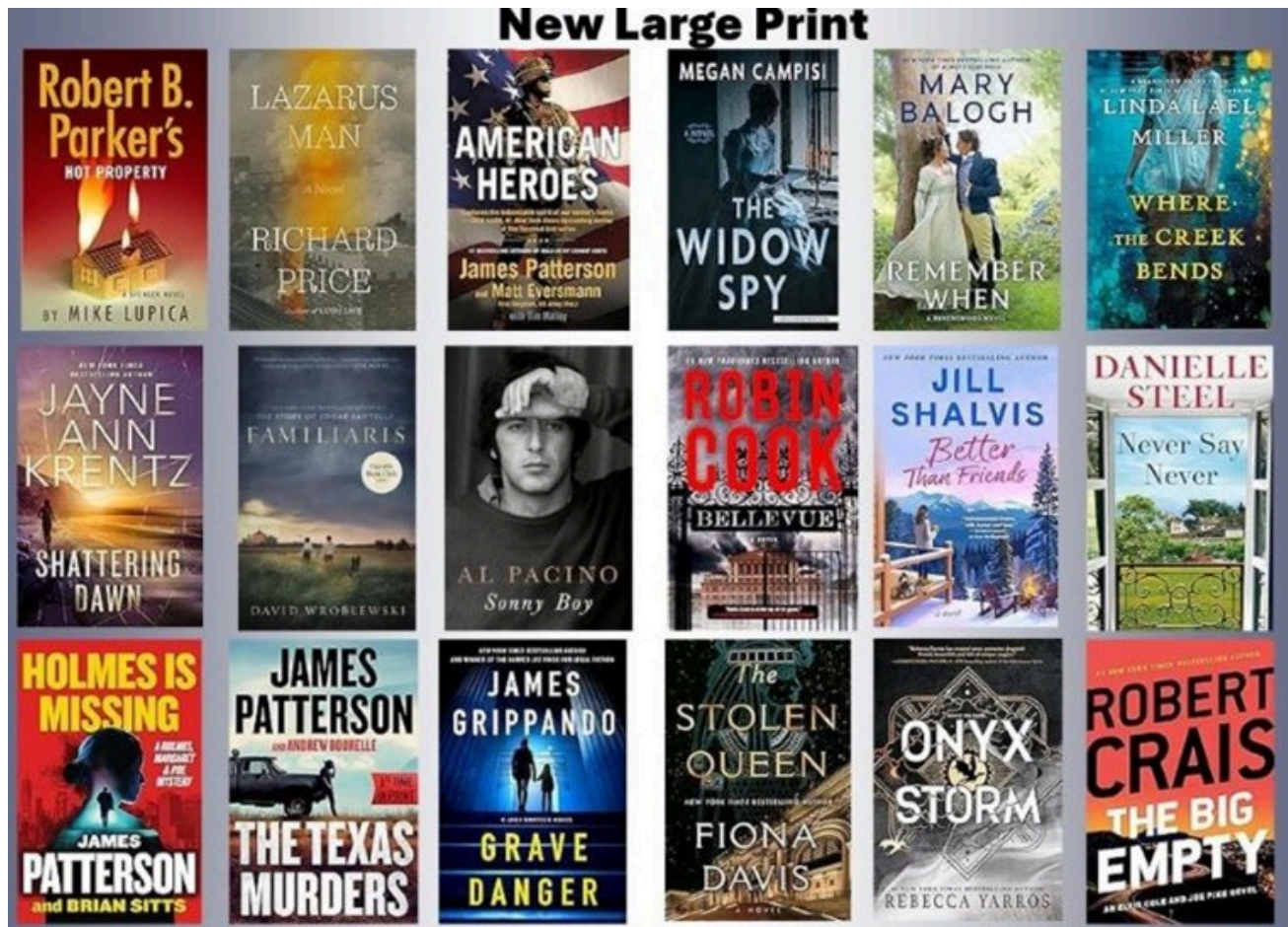

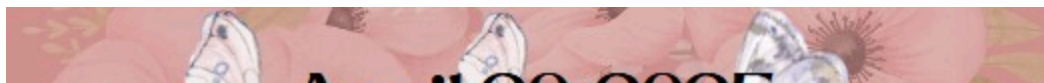

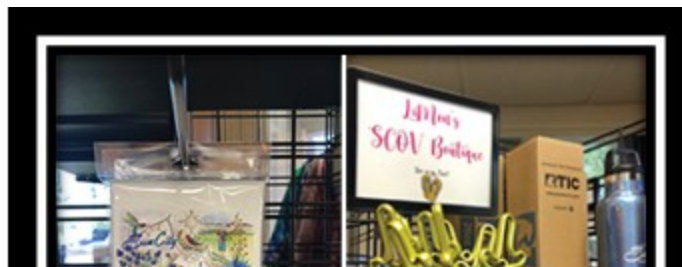
