Vote Update: As of 9:50 am, Thursday, 1,244 votes have been cast. To reach the 60% threshold of the 2,474 eligible votes, a total of 1,484 votes is required. This means 240 additional votes are needed to meet the threshold for Initiative 2 (Special Assessment).

Solar Project Update: Work may begin Monday, pending final permits. Expect equipment staging, fencing, and limited parking at the AFC and Artisan Center. Please use caution near the area. Construction will last 8–9 weeks. Thank you for your patience during this important improvement project.



Restaurant Repair Update: While repair bids are being finalized and the affected area is being dried out, the restaurant manager and facilities superintendent are coordinating the best time to complete the

necessary repairs. Please note that the work will require the water to be turned off in the restaurant. You will be notified as soon as the repair date is scheduled.

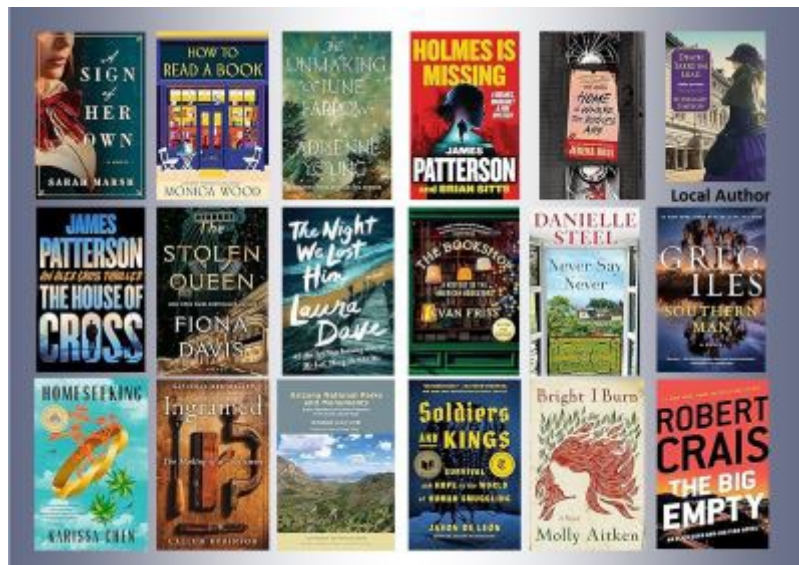
