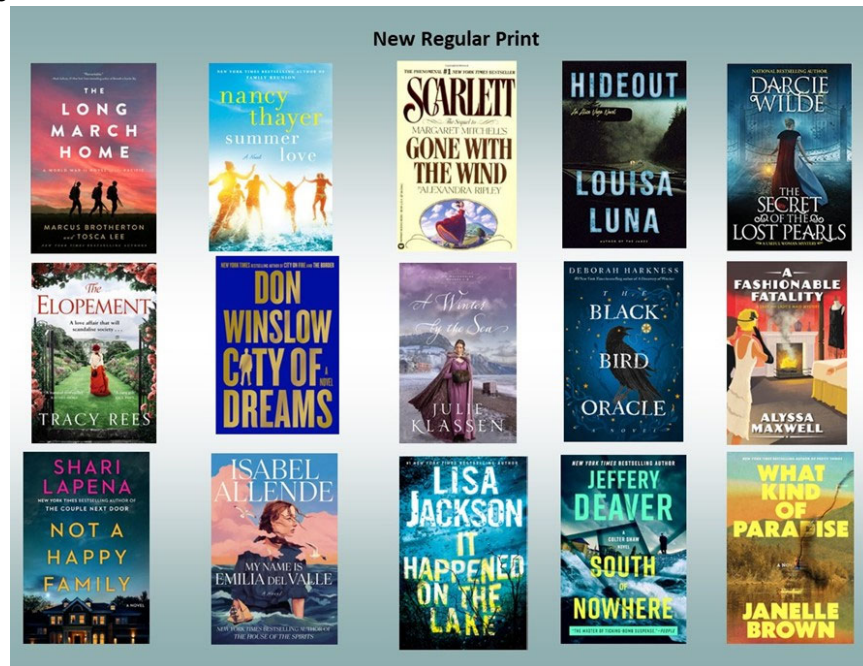

Friendly Reminder Trash Container Storage: We've noticed an increase in trash containers being visible from the street or neighboring properties. As a gentle reminder to help keep our community looking its best, trash containers must be stored out of sight, either in your garage or screened from view using plant material or approved structures. Screening structures must be at least 48" high and constructed of stucco or masonry to match the home or existing walls, with a solid or perforated metal backing to block the view. Plant screening should be dense enough in height and width to fully conceal the containers. All trash storage must also comply with Section 4.9 of the Master Declaration. Thank you for doing your part to maintain the beauty of our community!
