

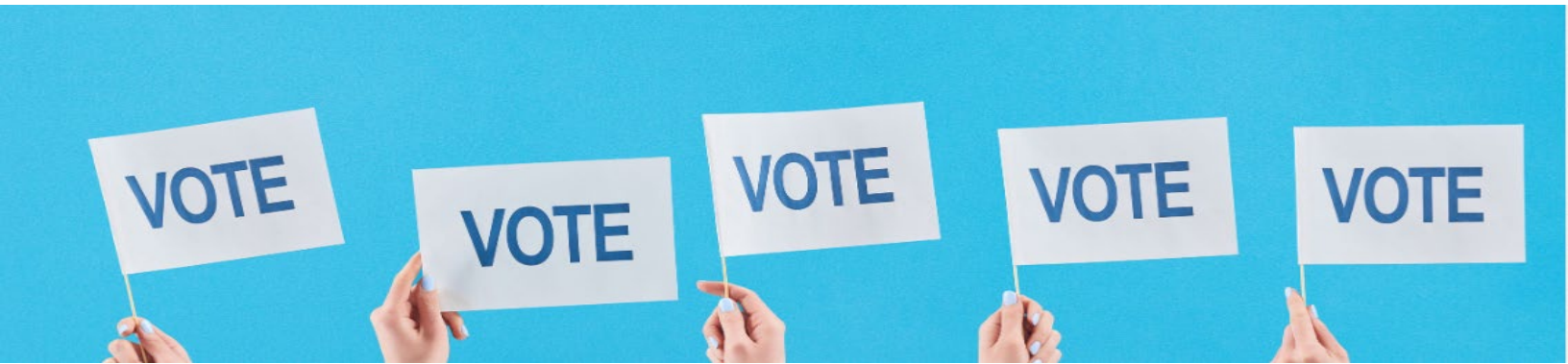

## Association News

**Pools & Spa Project 2026:** The Desert Oasis pool is closed, and work is actively underway. Construction is progressing as planned, with crews on site completing scheduled improvements including floor drains, handrails, chemical distribution, Clear Comfort (an advanced oxidation process), new deck, plaster acid washed and waterline tiles cleaned.

**The Copper Center will be open** on a limited basis starting Monday, February 9, temporary building hours are Monday–Saturday, 9 am–8 pm, and Sunday 9 am–4 pm, for table tennis and non-reserved card games. Internet service and secure access are still in progress, so the building will be opened and closed manually each day. Please enter through the northwest door. As this is an active work zone, expect noise and vendor activity. We will share updates as availability expands.

**SCOV Distinguished Service Award:** The Board of Directors is accepting nominations for residents you feel should be considered for the SCOV *Distinguished Service Award*. This award is designed to honor residents who make remarkable contributions to our community. Nominations should be submitted by Noon on Saturday, February 28. The Board will review the nominees and select the recipient(s). The award will be presented at the SCOV Annual Meeting in March. You can find the form on the website under Trending > Distinguished Service Award Nomination.

**Copper Center:** Great News! We now have a Certificate of Occupancy. Please come to the community meeting Tuesday, February 10, 9 am, Activity Center/Kiva Room for an update on what's happening. Bruce Hackel of Long Range Planning will be the guest speaker and available to answer your questions about the relationship between the Copper Center and the long range plan.

**The regular Aquatic and Fitness Center (AFC)** pool cleaning closure for Tuesday, February 10 will be canceled, since the AFC pool will close for renovation on Friday, February 13. Lap lanes have been opened for reservations for that day.

**Bicycle Safety Reminder:** All cyclists are required to follow posted signage and community rules. Please ride responsibly, yield to pedestrians, and obey all traffic and safety signs while traveling through the community. Your cooperation is necessary to help keep everyone safe.

**The Lion Head fountain continues** through the decision process with the Town of Oro Valley. Staff review formally established our non-compliant code status, as expected. Staff recommendations were addressed in the design, enabling us to move to the next step, working with the Town on a presentation video for Planning and Zoning review.

**In March 2023, the community voted** to purchase the Copper Center facility for \$4.5m. There was \$12m in the bank with \$1.8m allocated to Capital. Another \$2.7m was used and then paid back over the next 27 months. That borrowing and payback was tracked by carrying a negative balance in the Capital fund. Those funds were replenished, with interest, and without the need for a specific dues contribution increase or a special assessment.


In 2014, the community approved a \$1.75 million renovation of the Aquatic and Fitness Center (AFC), funded in part by a \$385 Special Assessment. Adjusted for inflation, that project would cost \$2.38 million today, and the assessment would have needed to be \$539. Most residents would agree in the long run, it was a good investment for the community, whether in 2014 dollars or 2025 dollars.
