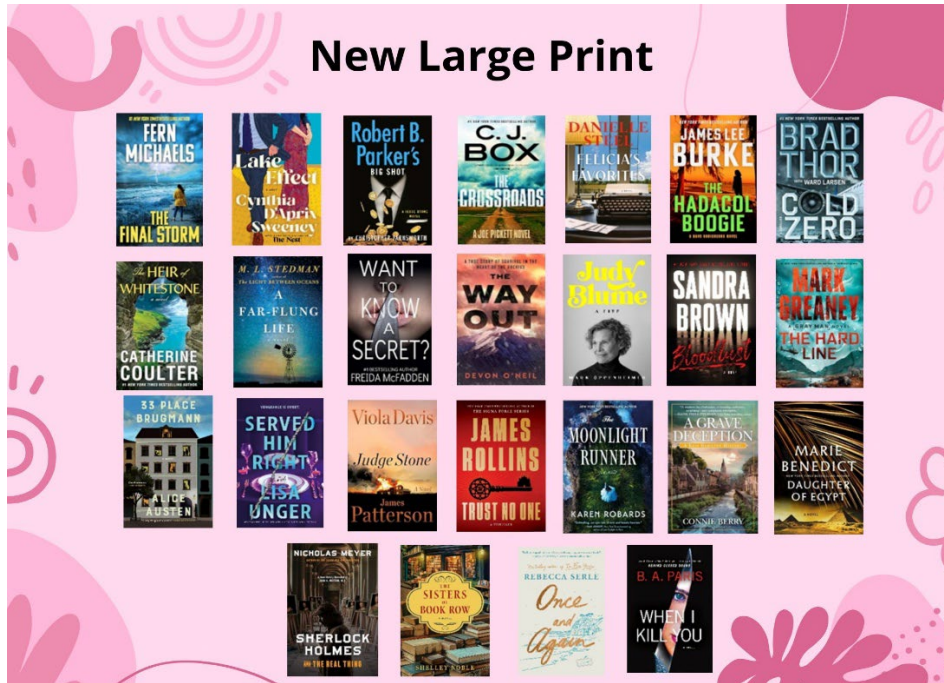
Pools & Spa Project 2026 - To provide information on the delay, there is a requirement by Pima County for plans to be stamped by a specific type of engineer before submitting the plans to Pima County (or the Town of Oro Valley). These engineers are on a list of engineers that Pima County will accept stamped projects from, or the selected engineer meets some type of qualification that stamped plans from them would be acceptable to Pima County. These engineers received the plans from our contractor's representative in February 2026, but didn't review the plans in February, or March and now through April 20 when our contractor, at their own expense, negotiated an agreement to pay additional money for the plans to be prioritized. At this point the plans will be reviewed. Once stamped, they will be submitted to Pima County and the Town of Oro Valley for approval. Once approved, then the remaining plumbing, gas and electrical work can be completed. In that process the heaters will then be turned on, and the pool will be opened. We'll keep you updated.

Outdoor Furniture in Front Yards Development Standards Section 2.18.C.14: Outdoor furniture, including umbrellas and benches, is permitted only on covered porches and patios, in Courtyards, and in Rear Yards. Such furniture is not permitted in open or unenclosed portions of Front Yards, Street Facing Side Yards, Street Facing Rear Yards, or Side Lot Setbacks (as set forth in Appendix A). The exception to this limitation involves models where the original developer created either arched walls or a concrete pad intended to be used as a patio. The models are Silver Creek, Pacifica, Dakota, Dillon, and Cumberland. Outdoor furniture must be in good condition and shall be Neat and Attractive.
