Association News

AFC Pool Opening Delayed - The AFC Pool is operationally close to completion, with circulation, sanitation, and handrail installation underway. However, it cannot open until final permits are secured. The delay is due to plan approval by the Pima County pool engineers. The plans were submitted about six weeks ago, longer than the typical four-week turnaround. Our project engineer has followed up regularly and submitted the plans to additional approved engineers due to lack of response. Once the approval is received, the final County and Town walkthroughs can occur, and the project can be completed. Construction is largely finished; remaining items are administrative approvals and minor details. The timeline for approval is currently unknown and dependent on Pima County. Updates on the approval progress will be made on the Projects page and in TWISCOV. Should approval come through, an email will be sent with opening information.

Join us for our community cleanup day, Tuesday, April 14. Three dumpsters will be at SCOV near the library side of the Welcome Center. Come early as they fill up fast. Load items directly inside—no overfilling or outside dumping. No hazardous materials, paint, needles, or large appliances. Thanks for helping keep our community looking its best!

As a reminder to all residents, according to current SCOV Development Standards, Section 2.5, and the 1st Amended Master Declaration, Section 4.9, "Trash containers may be stored on the lot as to be not visible from neighboring property or street. If trash/recycle containers cannot be stored to be not visible from neighboring property or street, then containers must be stored in the garage. In no event shall such containers be maintained to be visible from neighboring property, except when made available for collection, and then for the shortest time reasonably necessary to affect such collection."

Summer is fast approaching, and soon we will be saying goodbye to those who are leaving our community for the warmer months. It is important to ensure that your home and yard are cared for while you are away, even if only for a portion of the time. A neglected yard can signal that you are not present, potentially putting your property and belongings at risk. Let Administration know so they can contact you if necessary. In Case You Missed It: In January, our Capital Fund moved officially into the black. What this means is the money we borrowed from ourselves to help pay for the Copper Center, all \$2.752 million was replenished with interest. We also paid for the \$303,000 solar addition, still expecting the \$97,000 Federal Credit which will add to the balance. Once again, we own everything we have at SCOV.
