Association News

Pools & Spa Project 2026 - The project is now estimated to be at least five weeks from completion. The primary cause of the delay relates to a requirement by Pima County that project plans be reviewed and stamped by specialized engineers before submission to Pima County or the Town of Oro Valley. We were advised that the limited number of qualified engineers and their high workload contributed to our project not being prioritized. The contractor's representative submitted the plans to the required engineers in February 2026; however, they were not reviewed in February or March and remained pending through April 30. At that point, our contractor, at their own expense, arranged for additional compensation to expedite the review process. The electrical engineering review has now been completed and pending their approval stamp. The remaining reviews involve the engineers responsible for gas and plumbing systems. The engineer engaged in this work also supported the AFC renovation in 2012 and is therefore already familiar with the building. Once all required stamps are secured, the plans will be submitted to Pima County, followed by the Town of Oro Valley for final approval. After approvals are received, the remaining plumbing, gas, and electrical work will be completed, at which point the heaters will be activated and the pool will reopen. It's also important to note that the work completed thus far did not require a permit. We will continue to provide updates as the project progresses.

Goatscaping in SCOV - Natural landscaping is coming to the community as goat grazing takes place from approximately Friday, May 8 through Sunday, June 21. During this time, please do not feed the goats anything, including treats, keep all dogs leashed and outside the fenced areas, and do not touch the fencing. For awareness, goats typically take one to three days to clear an area, and overnight protective service animals will be present to ensure their safety.

The Views Restaurant – Leadership Update: Ricardo has officially been named Food and Beverage Manager at The Views Restaurant. We will also be recruiting a second manager to support the operation. This isn't about titles, it's about coverage. With the restaurant open long hours, seven days a week, additional leadership is necessary to maintain service, support staff, and ensure consistency. Thank you for your support.

Resident Advisory – Reported Home Break-In. We want to make residents aware that a homeowner reported a break-in that occurred overnight on Tuesday, April 28. The incident took place between approximately 7:30 pm and 6 am in Unit 6. Unknown individuals gained access through the garage and then entered the home. Several items were stolen, including power tools. Based on the quantity and type of items taken, it is likely a large truck or similar vehicle was used to remove them. A police report has been filed. As a reminder, please ensure that garage doors, entry doors, and vehicles are secured, especially overnight. If you see any suspicious activity, report it immediately to local law enforcement.

It's an exciting time for the Copper Center. Meetings with the architect are now taking place weekly to finalize the design. In the coming months, the architect plans to meet with all club representatives to ensure their needs are reflected in the design and to make adjustments where necessary. Several clubs are currently growing, including the Thimblelenas and the Glass Club, each with about 200 members. It's important that the new space supports this growth in a practical and functional way. Keep in mind that this will be a working building, not an Activity Center, so funding will be used to support functionality. While the building will be attractive, the primary focus will be on how well it serves its purpose. Stay tuned.

At last week's Board meeting, Oro Valley Councilmember Joyce Jones-Ivey provided an update on fiber installation in Oro Valley. The Town cannot legally prevent companies from installing fiber infrastructure, so it is likely that multiple providers will be working throughout the community. Oversight of these installations falls under the Town's jurisdiction.
