Association News

Pools & Spa Project 2026 - The DO pool will return to its regular monthly cleaning schedule on the second Wednesday of each month. The AFC pool and spa plans have now received the required engineering stamps. The project is moving forward with submission to Pima County, followed by the Town of Oro Valley. Updated Children's Hours at the Desert Oasis Pool are Tuesday through Sunday from 12 - 2 pm. These temporary hours will remain in place until the Aquatic and Fitness Center Pool reopens, providing a designated time for families and children to enjoy the pool safely.

Republic Trash Reminder: Monday's trash and recycle service will run as normal despite the holiday. Please have your bins at the curb at 6am on Monday as usual.

Goatscaping in SCOV - Goat grazing continues to approximately June 21. During this time, please do not feed the goats anything, including treats, keep all dogs leashed and outside the fenced areas, and do not touch the fencing. For awareness, goats typically take one to three days to clear an area, and overnight protective service animals will be present to ensure their safety.

Copper Center Update - The work team is continuing to meet with clubs and services and with the architect. Robin Coulter and Chris Pacheco have met with every group except one to finalize internet/WIFI needs. Copper Center has a fiber system with a 99% reliability rating, so we are in great shape. New equipment uses WIFI or allows downloads and updates using a flash drive. Interesting to note, we don't have to remove or change old cabling – we can leave it in place. The Work Team and architect are also looking at flexibility for the future. Having larger club rooms creates a greater sense of community and provides for future use by different groups. One thing we know is that as times change, trends and interests also change. It's important to use Copper Center space in a way that allows a change of use as our needs change.

Roofing Scam Alert: Residents are reminded that no contractor should be on your property or roof without your permission. Be cautious of unsolicited roof inspections or repair offers. Always verify licenses, references, and credentials before hiring, and never pre-pay in full for work. Report suspicious activity to Sun City management or local authorities.

As a reminder to all residents, according to current SCOV Development Standards, Section 2.5, and the 1st Amended Master Declaration, Section 4.9, "Trash containers may be stored on the lot as to be not visible from neighboring property or street. If trash/recycle containers cannot be stored to be not visible from neighboring property or street, then containers must be stored in the garage. In no event shall such containers be maintained to be visible from neighboring property, except when made available for collection, and then for the shortest time reasonably necessary to affect such collection."
