### **Association News**

**Pools & Spa Project 2026** - The Desert Oasis pool will return to its regular monthly cleaning schedule on the second Wednesday of each month. The Activity and Fitness Center pool and spa plans have now received the required engineering stamps. The project is moving forward with submission to Pima County, followed by the Town of Oro Valley. Updated Children's Hours at the Desert Oasis Pool are Tuesday through Sunday from Noon - 2 pm. These temporary hours will remain in place until the Aquatic and Fitness Center Pool reopens, providing a designated time for families and children to enjoy the pool safely.

**Copper Center Update** - The architect is continuing to meet with the Work Group on space and floor layouts. The primary effort right now is to focus on setting floor layouts and increasing building efficiency. Meetings have been held with most all of the stakeholders on their floor layouts. Once this step is complete, engineers such as mechanical, electrical and structural, will begin their reviews.

**New Process for ARC & In-House Submittal Approvals** The ARC is implementing a new process to alert residents to projects that have Association approval. Beginning Wednesday, July 1 a yellow permit will be issued to owners upon an In-House or ARC approval made after July 1. This permit can be picked up at the Welcome Center after July 1. The permit must be displayed in a front window visible from the street until project completion. Owners whose projects were approved prior to July 1 should request a permit by contacting Katy Mosier at [kmosier@suncityorovalley.com](mailto:kmosier@suncityorovalley.com).

**OV Town Council voted 6-1 in favor** of a text amendment allowing SCOV use of the Lion Head Fountain at a reduced water volume. Mayor Winfield voted in favor while urging residents to practice water conservation at home. SCOV is clear to proceed with the repair process of this asset.

Always verify licenses, references, and credentials before hiring, and never pre-pay in full for work. Report suspicious activity to Sun City management or local authorities.

## **SCOV Celebrates USA's 250**

With just seven weeks until the Fourth of July, this is an appropriate moment to reflect on 1776, when America declared its independence and began its journey as a united nation.

### **Celebrating 250 Years of the United States through Unity, Kindness, and Neighbors Helping Neighbors**

#### **Unity**

The Declaration: Despite deep divisions between Patriots and Loyalists, the signing of the Declaration of Independence on July 4, 1776, expressed a shared commitment to equality and common purpose. The document underwent 86 revisions between Thomas Jefferson's first draft and the final ratified version, as the Continental Congress worked through both minor edits and major deletions to reach consensus.

#### **Kindness**

After the American victory at the Battle of Trenton on December 26, 1776, Hessian Colonel Johann Gottlieb Rall was mortally wounded. Rather than celebrate his enemy's suffering, General George Washington visited Rall at his deathbed. At Rall's request, Washington promised humane treatment for the captured Hessian soldiers and later hosted several of them for dinner.

#### **Neighbor helping neighbor**

Life in 18th-century farming communities demanded hard physical labor. When a newcomer or neighboring family needed help raising a barn, building a home, or bringing in a harvest, the community often came together to complete the work in just a few days.

Over the next seven weeks, SCOV residents will share experiences from this community that reflect these values of the Founding Fathers.
