Association News

Pool Project Update – We are pleased to report continued progress on the Pool & Spa Project. The required permits from both Pima County and the Town of Oro Valley have been approved, and the Town's final inspection is scheduled for today, June 25. Pending a successful inspection, the pool will reopen, and a push notification and community-wide email will be sent with reopening information. The lap lane reservation system is expected to reopen on Friday. Please note that the new heaters are not yet operational, so the pool water will be on the refreshing side for the time being. The remaining major components of the project include increasing the size of the gas meter in coordination with Southwest Gas, completing the venting requirements for the new heaters, and starting up and commissioning the new heating system. We appreciate your patience throughout this project and will continue to provide updates as work progresses toward full completion.

Copper Center Update: The final design layout is being completed, with club input and approval. The next step is to bring in the engineers for their review and recommendations. This should take place in July. At the same time, the architects will move forward with final construction documents. The architects and Work Team have increased use of the building to 16,954 sq ft. All other space is designated as “access” space, which in our case meets entry/exit and hallways. This allows some small meeting room space available for groups when needed, as well as potential future club space. Stay tuned for a community meeting in the early fall with the architects that will also be available on Zoom. All questions will be welcomed.

Golf Cart Parking: Throughout our community, there are designated golf cart parking spaces that are shorter in length and are specifically designed for golf carts. Please refrain from parking automobiles in these spaces, as they are reserved exclusively for golf carts. This does not include 'dual use' spaces, which can be used for both.



Motorized Scooters and Sidewalk Safety - We recently received a report of a motorized scooter traveling at a high rate of speed on a sidewalk, causing a resident walking their dog to step aside. As a reminder, sidewalks are intended for pedestrians. In Oro Valley, motorized scooters are generally not permitted on public sidewalks and are instead allowed on local streets, bicycle lanes, and designated multi-use paths such as the Chuck Huckelberry Loop. When your grandkids are visiting, help keep our community safe by ensuring scooters are operated in appropriate areas and with consideration for others.

New ARC & In-House Permits The ARC is implementing a new process to alert residents to projects that have Association approval. Beginning July 1, a yellow permit will be issued to owners upon an In-House or ARC approval made after July 1. The Project Approval Permit can be picked up at the Welcome Center after July 1. After receiving an approval for a project, this permit must be displayed in a front window visible from the street until project completion. 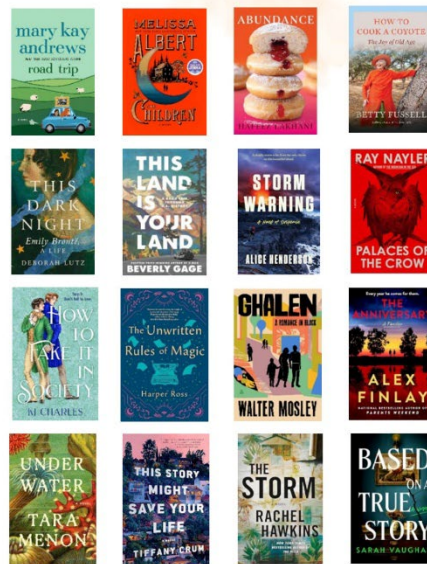

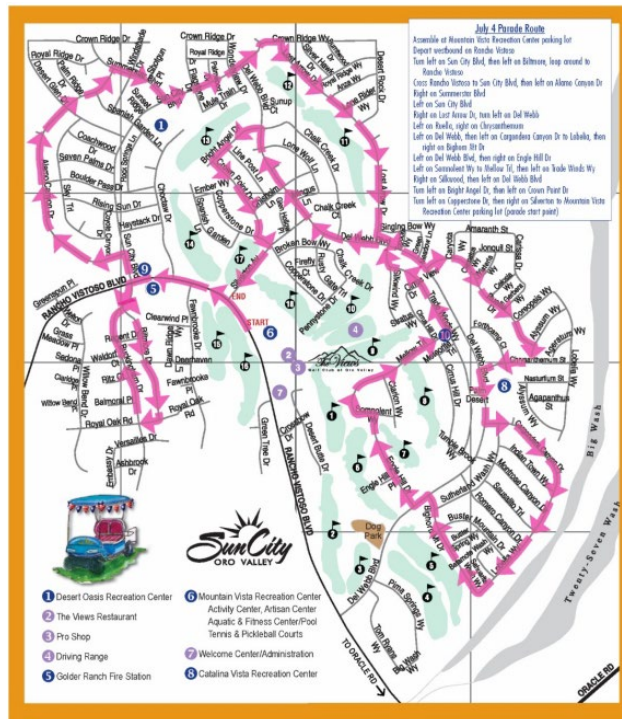
