Association News

Pools & Spa Project 2026 - The Activity and Fitness Center pool and spa plans are now with Pima County as of Friday, May 29. Once approved by Pima County they will go to the Town of Oro Valley for review and approval. Once approved, the remaining plumbing and electrical work can take place. The extended delay is of concern to all and your continued patience is appreciated.

Pool Reservation Clarification - There appears to be some misunderstanding regarding the purpose of the Pool Usage Task Force. The Task Force was created to study and analyze all pool usage (classes, casual swimming, lap lane swimming), develop recommendations to optimize scheduling and maximize access for residents. Its intent is to evaluate and work within the existing lap lane reservation program, not to predetermine changes or eliminate the current reservation system.

Fraud Alert: Protect Yourself and Your Property - Residents are reminded to be cautious of unsolicited visitors requesting signatures, personal information, or access to your property. Scammers can obtain surprisingly detailed personal information from public and commercial databases to appear legitimate. Never sign documents, provide personal information, or feel pressured to engage with unknown individuals at your door. If something seems suspicious, trust your instincts, end the conversation, and report concerns to local authorities. Staying alert and looking out for one another helps protect our community.

Scam Alert: Roofing Repair Fraud - Residents are advised to be cautious of individuals claiming they noticed roof damage from the street or while checking on past roofing projects. The apparent scam involves requesting a wire transfer or upfront payment before work begins. Always verify damage independently, obtain multiple estimates, and never send funds before confirming the contractor's legitimacy and the need for repairs.

Community Alert: Mail Theft Reported - A resident has reported that their mail was stolen. Please remain vigilant and regularly check your mailbox for expected deliveries. If you discover that your mail has been stolen or tampered with, contact the Oro Valley Police immediately and notify the U.S. Postal Service. Prompt reporting can help authorities investigate and prevent additional incidents.

Copper Center Update - The architect is continuing to meet with the Work Group on space and floor layouts. The primary effort right now is to focus on setting floor layouts and increasing building efficiency. Meetings have been held with most of all the stakeholders on their floor layouts. Once this step is complete, engineers such as mechanical, electrical and structural, will begin their reviews.

Renting Your Home: With the recent governing document amendments, rental requirements have changed. Owners must submit a Rent My Home Application and acknowledge the new process to remain on the rental list. Forms and requirements are available on our website under Members > Member Services > Rent Your Home > Becoming a Rental Property.

News from a Neighbor: The Highlands at Dove Mountain is currently renovating 2,200 sq ft and adding 2,800 sq ft to their Arts & Crafts facilities. The cost for this work is \$1.6 million, or \$320 per square foot. If we compare our Copper Center projection of \$326 per square foot for the overall purchase and renovation, the \$6 difference could be that we bought land when we purchased the building. The Highlands built on land they already owned.

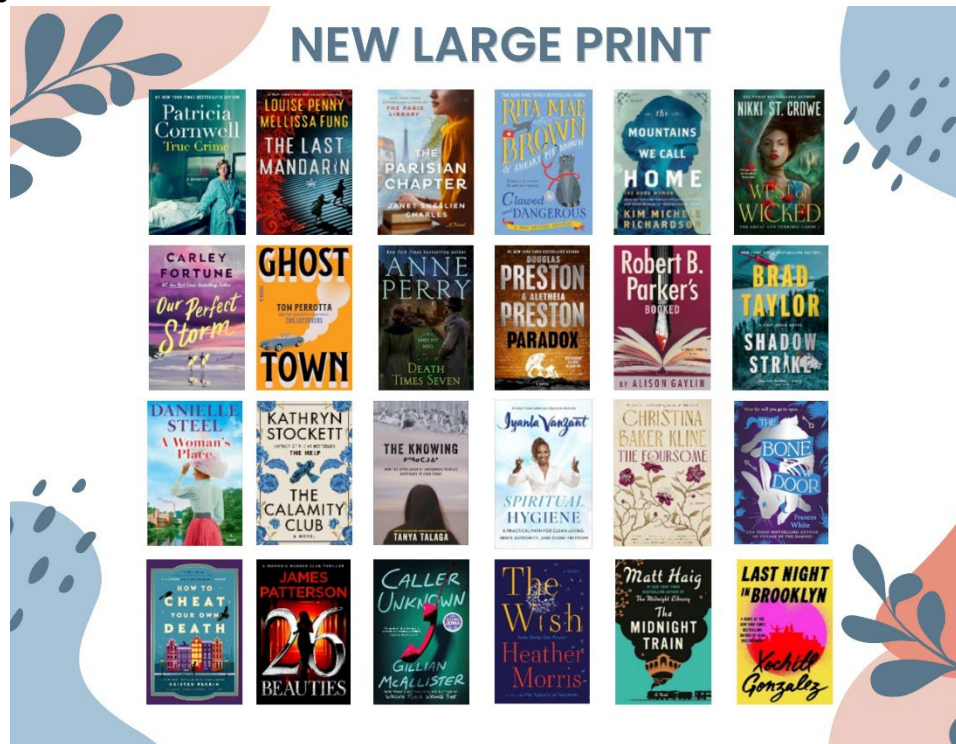
