Help Us Plan "40 and Fabulous"

In the fall of 2026, SCOV turns 40 years old! The Board of Directors has approved a special committee to plan and coordinate a month-long celebration of all things Sun City Oro Valley. At this time, we envision multiple sports tournaments, talent performances, an artisan show and so much more. And the celebration will conclude with a formal dinner and dance.

The "Forty and Fabulous" SCOV 40th Anniversary Celebration is an initiative developed by the Supplemental Revenue Stream Task Force. This month-long event invites all clubs to participate, with support from the Anniversary Committees, by organizing activities that will raise funds for their respective treasuries.

Examples of potential events include a tournament hosted by the Pickleball Club, collaborative gatherings organized by the Golf Leagues, and an art competition. In addition to club-specific programs, there will be fundraising activities dedicated to supporting the Capital Fund.

Community Announcement: Solicitors and Handbill Distribution in Oro Valley. Residents have recently raised questions regarding solicitors and handbill distribution. Please note the following: Solicitors- Solicitors must hold a formal license and badge issued by the Town of Oro Valley, regulated jointly by the Community and Economic Development Department (CED) and the Oro Valley Police Department. • Licensing involves a strict application process, background checks, and behavioral requirements to ensure compliance and resident safety. • If approached by a solicitor, you may request to see their official Town-issued badge and license. Handbill Distribution (Flyers, Door Hangers, etc.) • Handbill distribution is loosely regulated—a license is not required. • However, distributors must comply with Oro Valley Code Article 10-9-8, which prohibits littering and trespass. • Residents may remove unwanted flyers but should report concerns of noncompliance to the Town of Oro Valley, not the HOA. Important Note SCOV does not have enforcement authority over solicitors or handbill distributors. Any issues or concerns should be directed to the Town of Oro Valley through appropriate channels. For questions or to report a violation, please contact the Town of Oro Valley, (520) 229-4800, or the Oro Valley Police Department (non-emergency line).
