Friendly Reminder Trash Container Storage: We've noticed an increase in trash containers being visible from the street or neighboring properties. As a gentle reminder to help keep our community looking its best, trash containers must be stored out of sight, either in your garage or screened from view using plant material or approved structures. Screening structures must be at least 48" high and constructed of stucco or masonry to match the home or existing walls, with a solid or perforated metal

backing to block the view. Plant screening should be dense enough in height and width to fully conceal the containers. All trash storage must also comply with Section 4.9 of the Master Declaration. Thank you for doing your part to maintain the beauty of our community!

Pool and Guest Reminder: As a friendly reminder, all guests must be signed in by the homeowner upon entering the pool area. Homeowners do not need to remain with their guests unless the guests are minors, in which case an adult must be present at all times. Guests with a valid guest card may enter on their own but are still required to sign in. Please also remember: Shower before entering the pool. Follow all posted pool rules. Be respectful of others using the facilities. If you observe any issues or have concerns while at the pool, please notify a monitor immediately. Thank you for helping us keep the pool area safe and enjoyable for everyone!
