Association News

Tree removal this past weekend, social media was abuzz with talk about SCOV potentially removing some large trees. We want to confirm that this is not a rumor, it is true. Seven trees have been identified for removal because they are causing significant damage to asphalt, curbs, and other infrastructure. This action follows the recommendation of our asphalt engineers, who determined that removal is necessary to prevent further damage and protect the integrity of our community assets. On Monday, September 22, SCOV signed a contract with BrightView to carry out the removal work. Once the asphalt work is complete, the areas where the trees were removed will be evaluated to determine what, if anything, should be replanted in those locations. We understand that trees are a valued part of our community, and decisions like this are never made lightly. Thank you for your understanding, as we take this important step to preserve our shared spaces.

What's infiltrating our streets? The invasive weed known as Spurge is making its presence felt everywhere, creeping along sidewalks and roadways. This persistent plant should never be simply pulled, as its deep taproot harbors numerous seeds; for everyone you remove, several more will emerge. It seems to multiply almost overnight, particularly noticeable in the cracks where concrete meets asphalt. Take a moment to spray the Spurge in your yard and along your property line. Only after it has died should you attempt to pull it out. Both the Neighborhood Pride Committee and your fellow residents will appreciate your efforts, as this weed continues to dominate our community and encroach upon our streets.

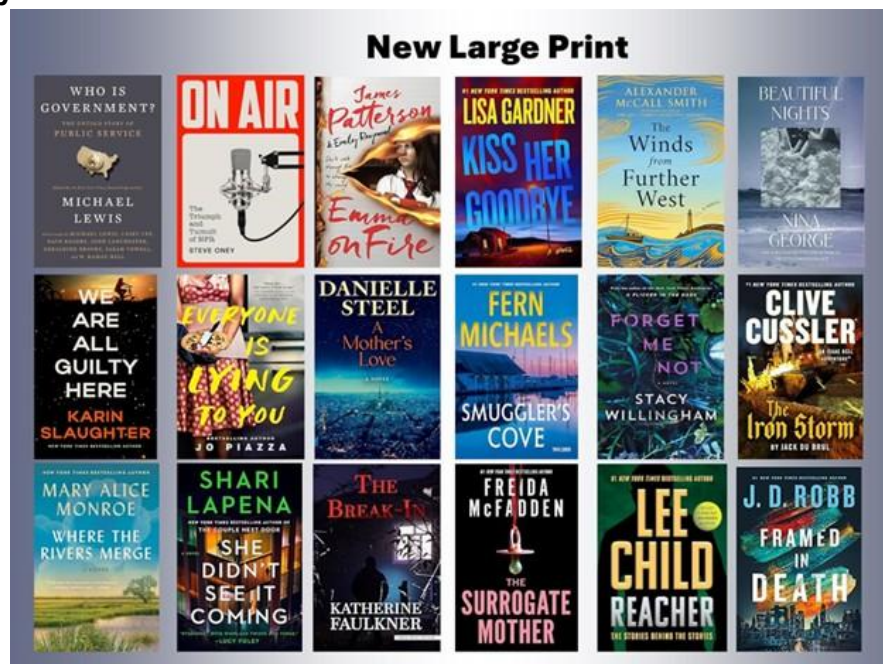

Overseeding of the golf course continues through Sunday, October 5. It will reopen for play on Monday, October 6. During this period, residents are kindly asked not to drive golf carts or walk on the course to allow the new grass seed to be properly planted and watered.

Pro Shop Hours:

- Limited hours will be in effect through October 5, with the shop open from 8 am–noon. We return to 6 am–5 pm on October 6.
- Be aware that the sprinkler system runs every other hour on the practice tee and putting green.
- Range balls may only be purchased during the hours of 8 am–noon.
- The driving range still closes early on Thursdays at 3:30 pm.

Driving range, short game area, and putting green accessibility: During the overseeding process, the golf course, short game area, and main putting green will be closed. The driving range tee will offer restricted access. Players will be able to hit balls off the artificial turf tee line (mats only).

When play resumes on Monday, October 6, the course will be cart path only.
